AD HOC COMMITTEES

Whenever the Board deems it necessary, the Board may appoint a committee composed of community members, staff or students to assist the Board. Committees formed by the Board will be called ad hoc committees.

An ad hoc committee is formed by Board resolution, which will outline the duties and purpose of the committee. The committee is advisory in nature and has no duty or responsibility other than that specifically stated in the Board resolution. The committee will automatically dissolve upon the delivery of its final recommendation to the Board or upon completion of the duties outlined in the Board resolution. The Board will receive the report of the committee for consideration. The Board retains the authority to make a final decision on the issue. The committee will be subject to the open meetings law.

The method for selection of committee members will be stated in the Board resolution. When possible, and when the necessary expertise required allows, the committee members will be representative of the school district community and may consider the various viewpoints on the issue. The Board may designate a Board member and the superintendent to serve on an ad hoc committee. The committee will select its own chairperson, unless the Board designates otherwise.
