GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE EDUCATION PROGRAM

The goals and objectives of the school district are designed to achieve the philosophy, mission and vision statements of the school district. An advisory committee of representatives of the school district community and the school district (School Improvement Advisory Committee - SIAC) is appointed to make recommendations for the goals and objectives of the education program.

Short-term objectives for the education program are established annually by the District Administration and reviewed annually by the Board. Long-term objectives for the education program are approved annually by the Board. These objectives will reflect the results of needs assessments, recommendations of the School Improvement Advisory Committee, recommendations from the superintendent, and changes in law.

The Board's objective in the design, contents and the delivery of the education program is to provide an equal opportunity for students to pursue an education free of discrimination on the basis of race, color, gender, gender identity, national origin, marital status, sexual orientation, socioeconomic status, religion, creed, age (for employment) or disability.

In providing the education program of the school district, the Board will strive to meet its overall goal of providing the students an opportunity to develop a healthy social, intellectual, emotional, and physical self concept in a learning environment that provides guidance, encourages critical thinking in students, and meets the requirements outlined in the Iowa Core curriculum and other legal requirements for schools.
