It's that time of year for juniors and seniors to sign up to take DMACC classes for the spring semester. This is a great opportunity for students to get a head start on the whole college experience plus no additional tuition cost for students. Students can begin their college career and start taking core college courses now. The deadline for enrollment is Friday November 18. Students may schedule an appointment in the guidance office.

Saydel High School Staff Highlight Q&A With Stephen Glenn


Q: Describe your career and educational background.


have to take the advice of REO Speedwagon and "Roll with the changes!"


Q: Why have you chosen to be a part of one of society's most rewarding and challenging professions?

Slow Cooker Sweet Potato Casserole

Do you need a super simple, healthy, crowd-pleasing Thanksgiving side? Try this recipe in your slow cooker to save valuable oven space and make your house smell fantastic.

Ingredients:

- 3 1/2-4 pounds sweet potatoes (roughly 5 medium)
- 2 medium apples
- 1/2 cup water
- 1/4 cup honey
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter (optional)
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup coarsely chopped pecans, lightly toasted

Directions:

- 1. Scrub and peel sweet potatoes and apples, chop them both into 1-inch cubes and place in slow cooker. With apples and potatoes in slow cooker, add water, honey, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt. Cover and cook on high for 3-3 1/2 hours until potatoes are very soft.
- 2. Mash potatoes with potato masher or forks until as smooth as you'd like. An electric mixer can be used if you desire a very smooth consistency.
- 3. Add butter (if using) and milk and stir until well combined. Sprinkle on toasted pecans.
- 4. Ready to serve! Turn your slow cooker to the "keep warm" setting and enjoy your meal!

Directions for toasting nuts: Toast pecans on rimmed cookie sheet in a single layer at 350 for 5-10 minutes or until golden brown. Chop into smaller pieces after toasting.

- Choose the whole-wheat dinner rolls over white dinner rolls. Extra fiber in the grains will keep you full longer.
- Opt for sugar-free cider and hot cocoa VS the full sugar variety.
- Choose home-made over store bought. Cooking food at home puts YOU in control of what you eat. Don't guess what ingredients are in your food.
