### **Principal's Message**

he start of the 2016-17 school year has been a huge success. We have 86 new 5th graders and over 35 students new to the district in grade 6-8 that have successfully made the transition. It is hard to imagine the students are quickly approaching the end of the first guarter. As mentioned in my Back to School communication, teachers will be spending time looking at ways to increase college and career awareness at Woodside this year. Subtle college and career awareness things have surfaced around the building already due to staff implementation of great ideas.

One of those ideas came from Kathy Erickson, Woodside school counselor. Kathy wanted each student to have the ability to experience multiple colleges before leaving Woodside. The idea surfaced when staff reviewed an article from the College Board Advocacy Center. The Center suggests there are eight components that can be implemented in K-12 schools to better prepare students for post-secondary options. Component 4 from the College Board states students need early and ongoing exposure to colleges and universities so they can make informed decisions about their future.

As a result of Kathy's idea and recommendation by the College Board, each grade at Woodside will take a field trip to a college campus this year. Our goal is for these college visits to become a tradition at Woodside. By the time a student leaves our middle school, they will have experienced a minimum of four different post secondary options. The following college visits are set for this year:

This time is utilized to provide additional academic support in reading, writing, behavior or extended learning for advanced students. For students who don't require assistance in those areas, they participate in EXPLORE class. This time can be used to explore new areas or dig deeper into their current classwork.

Students in Mrs. Zeutenhorst and Mrs. Erickson's 7th grade EXPLORE classes chose to use this time to focus on reading and service. Students selected a children's book and spent several weeks practicing to read the text fluently and with great expression.

# Fifth Graders Are Thinking Like Scientists!

F ifth graders are learning about fair and repeatable tests in science. They have discussed how scientists solve problems and spent time digging into one way that scientists solve problems through the application of the scientific method.

Students did a "blind" taste test to determine how many students could tell the difference between a name and generic brand of soda. They also investigated what color of M&M appears most often.

In this investigation, students collected data, averaged their data, and then reported out their findings to the class.

They represented their data on a bar graph as well. Next, students will apply their understanding of a fair test by controlling variables in a lab designed to see what makes popcorn pop. They will then create their own repeatable test related to popcorn. Students continue to work hard and apply their scientific thinking each day!

n math, students are working on ratios and proportions. Students have been working hard to find the constant of proportionality in realworld situations that often involve fractions. Next, students will be creating their own scale drawings.

In global studies, students have started the year looking at different types of maps and even creating their own! Currently, they are studying Latin America with a focus on the Mayan culture and people living near the Amazon River.



In science, students are focusing on animals and their habitats. Students have been playing the part

of a real scientist by taking careful observations of animals. Eventually, students will be using their knowledge to create an animal enclosure.

In literacy, students are learning all about Medieval times by reading the book "Castle Diary: The Journal of Tobias Burgess" by Richard Platt. Students will be reading other stories about the Middle Ages to support their answers to their essential question: How does society both support and limit the development of identity?
