Principal's Message

appy Thanksgiving week to Woodside Families. I hope this message finds you well as you are hopefully preparing to spend time with friends and family this holiday season. According to Forbes Magazine, Thanksgiving is the second most traveled holiday of the year. Be safe in your travels, but while you are traveling from one turkey gathering to the next, I hope you would engage in a conversation worthy of discussing in the car with your student. The question for discussion is: Should cell phones be allowed in school?

The inclusion of cell phones in school can be argued on both sides. A lot of research argues cell phones teach students important 21st century skills such as collaboration on group projects and allows students the ability to do "just in time" research for school related topics. The Sayel School Board agrees these are important skills for our students to have so they have invested a significant amount of money in our districts 1:1 Chromebook program. Each Woodside student has access to a computer anytime during the day to learn how to be a 21st century student and develop the skills previously mentioned in an appropriate manner.

A recent article I read suggested students are distracted 20% of the time while in class for schools that allow cell phones in class. This is partly due to the students not using the device for school related purposes while the teachers are delivering instruction. When access to social media sites such as Snapchat, Facebook, and Twitter are a finger scan away, students will opt to focus on their cellphone rather than the teacher. To remove the temptation of paying attention to their cell phone instead of their teachers, many schools are not allowing cell phones in school.

Removing the cellphone distraction is not the only reason Woodside has a no cell phone policy during school hours. Other reasons include increase of cyberbullying, reduction of effective face to face communication skills between students, and possible cheating. For these reasons, Woodside cellphone policy states:

Personal electronic devices should not hinder the education process. Such devices will not be used from 7:45am-2:45pm except during the students lunch period. Any electronic device brought into the building must be stored in a student locker and shut off. If a student is observed with a personal electronic device during school hours and without teacher consent, the following actions will be taken: (information on staff actions are outlined in the student handbook).

How can you help support the school policy?

Have a discussion with your child about the positives and

negatives of cell phones usage in school.

- Review the school policy with your child and determine how they are going to stay compliant with our policy.
- When communication between you and your child is needed during the school day, call the front office.

In closing, cellphones are a wonderful technology device assuming they are used at the right time and place. During school hours is not the proper time because of the distraction it causes in the classroom. Discussing this topic with your Woodside student and developing a simple plan of compliance is needed so teachers can focus on delivering quality instruction.
