Principal's Message

One way to measure the growth of a building is to review student assessment data. For the last five years Woodside students have completed the MAP test during the Fall, Winter, and Spring testing windows. The results are analyzed by teachers and administrators so informed decisions can be made to support continual growth of the individual students as well as the building. After analyzing the data over time, I am excited to share with everyone the progress Woodside has been making as the overall trend suggests continuous growth.

The average Woodside growth over the last three years from Fall to Winter testing has matched or exceeded the national expected growth with cumulative scores of 32.3, 28.8, and 28.9 compared to a national average of 28.4. Further, six of the eight grade/subject

combinations exceeded their expected growth during the 2017-18 fall to winter testing period. This means on average our student growth is outpacing the national average. I have included a summary of the MAP growth over the last five years for all grade levels and subjects for everyone to see the progress the building is making.

Serving as principal of Woodside, I am thrilled to share this news with everyone, but also recognize our work is not complete. Our team has reviewed the data set and is making instructional decisions based on the results. Thanks to the dedication of our students, teachers, and families, I am optimistic the success observed will continue. Students will be taking the Iowa Assessment test the week of April 9 and Spring MAP testing the week of May 7. Look for more information about these spring assessments from the district in the near future. In the meantime, if you have a Woodside student, ask them about MAP testing and celebrate in the growth!
