Principal's Message

Next week we will be begin our course registration for the 2018-2019 school year. This is an important piece of your student's high school career. There are a number of required courses, 31 credits, as well as variety of electives to fulfill 17 credits.

There are number of things to think about as you engage in conversations with your student about the courses they are selecting. What elective courses should your son or daughter take?

College Board has suggestions on how to choose high school electives:

- **1. Pursue your passions** Choosing a class in an area you enjoy or want to learn more about can be fun and help reduce stress.
- 2. Try something new You may discover a new talent or interest.
- **3.** Take courses post-secondary institutions would recommend Colleges want to see four years of foreign language. Apprenticeship programs would want to see you in classes to develop your math and tool skills.
- **4. Strengthen your transcript** By taking weighted courses, you have the opportunity to show that you have taken challenging courses as well as moved your GPA upward.

These suggestions would be good guidelines to follow, no matter your student's path after high school.

As you continue to have conversations with your student about their life after high school, there are a few tools that you can use in your conversations. Each student has access to a <u>four year planning tool</u> that focuses on course planning, career planning and options after high school. A great resource for career and college planning is <u>lowa College Access Network</u>. There is a wealth of information to help guide conversations and decision-making.

These are important conversations to have with your student that will have long-term impacts. Please let us know if you have questions or if you are looking for additional resources to support your student.

2018-2019 Course Registration

We will begin the 2018-2019 course scheduling process near the end of February and will continue into the beginning of March. We will be communicating with parents about the process and needing parents or guardians to speak with their student about the courses they are signing up for next year. We will be work to have parents sign off on the course selections during Parent-Teacher Conferences on March 1 and March 6.

Course Registration Process

During the months of February and March, Saydel High School students and 8th graders will be registering for courses for the 2018-2019 school year.

- Thursday, February 22 Mr. Schulte, Mr. Stubbers and Ms. Larson will meet with each grade level in small group settings to discuss the registration process, new courses offered next fall and to discuss the importance of planning for the future. We encourage parents to have conversations with students about taking classes that not only will prepare them for post-secondary endeavors but a wide variety of classes to explore their different interests.
- Friday, February 23 Ms. Larson and Mr. Stubbers will travel to Woodside to speak with the 8th graders about the many opportunities students will have when entering the high school next year.
- Friday, February 23 through Tuesday, February 27 Students in grades 9-11 will be working with their advisory teacher during the registration process. This process will begin with a transcript review followed by course evaluation and selection.
- Monday, February 26 at 7:00 pm 8th grade parents will have the
 opportunity to attend a high school course orientation. At this time
 parents will be able to ask questions regarding the registration process,
 post-secondary opportunities, and planning for the future.
- Thursday, March 1 and Tuesday March 7 from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm During parent-teacher conferences, parents will need to meet with their student's advisory teacher to sign off on the course selections. Once parents have signed the registration sheet the students will able to register for their classes electronically. If parents are unable to make conferences, an appointment may be set up with your child's advisor to review their course selections.

New Course Offerings in 2018-2019

ebruary's hot topic is registration for the 2018-2019 school year. Over the weeks leading up to Spring Break we will be working to have students register for the 2018-2019 school year. This is a great time for parents to have conversations with students about grades, classes and their student's future.

We have several new opportunities for the 2018-2019 school year:

- Computer Science Essentials This year-long course will expose students to computer science fundamentals and skills. Students will use both block coding and various languages to put their designs into practice.
- Computer Science Principles This course aligns with AP Computer Science and students will have the opportunity to take the AP test for this course. Students will be working with app development, cyber security and simulations.
- **Pre-apprenticeship** Students will begin work toward an apprenticeship program in a chosen career. The intent is

that this course will partner students with an employer and progress through a half of year in a four-year apprenticeship program.

Environmental Science – Students will be studying how humans interact with the natural world. It will examine effects of human actions on the environment and how policies and decisions influence human actions.

The Saydel Eagle Endowment (SEE), formerly known as Saydel Dollars for Scholars, was started in 2001 by a group of parents to raise money to provide scholarships to graduating seniors who were continuing their education at colleges and universities, area colleges, and trade schools. 2017 marked our 15th year

of awarding scholarships to



all students who completed the application process, which includes a written form and an in-person interview. We have an endowment fund in excess of \$175,000, which continues to grow from ongoing donations and investment growth.

This year we received donations from several sources, including the Saydel Homecoming Parade, the Monster Dash, and various individuals. We were especially pleased to work with a donor to honor their mother who graduated from Woodside High School, and another donor to honor the memory of a long-time high school teacher who made a positive impact on students. Another donation we were pleased to receive came from the mother of a current Cornell Elementary School teacher.

SEE is a non-profit organization under the laws of Iowa. We provide the same scholarship amount to all students, regardless of academic performance or financial need. The money is sent directly to the college or university after the student confirms his/ her registration for fall classes.
