

Four-Day School Week Update

Dear Saydel Families and Community Members,

As we conclude the 2024–25 school year, we would like to share highlights from our first full year of the four-day school week. Together, we've embraced innovation and seen meaningful improvements for our students, staff, and families. Here's what we've learned—and accomplished—thanks to your ongoing support.

Why a 4-Day School Week?

This shift was guided by our mission to serve the unique learning needs of each and every student. We made the change to:

- Support student and staff wellness
- Strengthen teacher recruitment and retention
- Create time for professional learning and collaboration

We knew this change would require thoughtful planning, and year one delivered promising results.

What the Data Tells Us

Student Attendance

Attendance trends remained steady. Our Eagles Nest program served 50-64 students each Friday,

providing a safe and supportive space for enrichment and care.

Staff Attendance

Staff absences decreased by 557 this year, reflecting improved wellness and resulting in greater instructional consistency.

Hiring & Retention

We hired 23 new staff members in 2023–24 and 13 more in 2024–25—strong signs that Saydel is attracting and keeping top talent.

Nutrition & Food Services

We ensured food security and access through:

• Distribution of 2,533 take-home meals via our partnership with the Food Bank of Iowa

Academic Achievement Highlights

English Language Arts (ELA)

- District-wide proficiency rose to 67%, up 10% from the prior year
- Several grade levels exceeded the state average of 71%
- Matched cohort growth showed significant gains, including a 34% increase in 4th grade

Math

- District-wide math proficiency rose to 60%, the highest since Iowa's test redesign in 2019
- 3rd grade scored a remarkable 83% proficiency
- · Cohort growth showed substantial gains across several grade levels

Special Education Growth

Our students with IEPs made strong gains:

- 84% showed growth, with 38% exceeding a year's growth
- 81% of students with math goals improved, and 40% exceeded a year's growth
- Students with behavioral IEPs had 21 proficient test scores

 These results reflect the power of our inclusive instructional systems and targeted support.

This year, we're setting the bar even higher. Our goals are:

- 100% of students with IEPs make at least a year's growth
- 50% exceed a year's growth on ISASP
- 100% of IEP goals met by each student's annual meeting

We're proud of the work that's been done and excited for what's ahead. Here's to another year of meaningful growth and inclusive learning!

English Learner (EL) Progress

Among 115 English Learners:

- 18 students exited EL services after scoring proficient in all tested areas
- Dozens of students showed growth of one level or more in reading, writing, listening, and speaking

These trends reflect strong language acquisition and academic development.

ELL Momentum and Post-Secondary Readiness

As we gear up for the 2025–26 school year, we're excited to share some impactful changes that will support our students academically, linguistically, and in their post-secondary planning.

One area of focused celebration is the momentum we've built within our **English Language Learners (ELL)** program. This summer, the ELL team collaborated to establish meaningful goals focused on student growth and success. At the district level, our target is that all identified ELL students will grow at least one proficiency level in two or more domains on the ELPA21 assessment, and all students will maintain their current proficiency levels each year.

Each building has also set specific ELL goals to track student progress and celebrate growth:

- Cornell Elementary: 29% (12 students) in grades 1-4 will exit ELL services by the end of the school year
- Woodside Middle School: 31% (8 students) will exit based on ELPA21 scores.
- Saydel High School: 34% (9 students) will exit by year's end.

These goals reflect our ongoing commitment to supporting multilingual learners and our belief that, with the right resources, every student can thrive.

We are also excited to further develop **Saydel's District Career & Academic Plan (DCAP)**. This plan will focus on exposing students to career pathways earlier in their educational journey, while helping our middle and high school students align their courses and training with postsecondary goals. Through the DCAP and students' **Individual Career & Academic Plans (ICAPs)**, we will ensure every student has the tools and guidance to explore, plan, and prepare for success beyond high school.

Continuous Improvement: Our Foundation for Success

Our academic success is built on intentional systems and deep investment in instructional excellence.

Key components of our continuous improvement strategy include:

- Weekly professional learning clusters focused on high-impact instructional strategies
- Instructional Leadership Teams (ILT) guiding data-informed decisions and supporting teachers.
- Regular classroom observations and feedback loops
- Targeted interventions through Reading Recovery, Literacy Lessons, and Heroes programs
- Support from NIET (National Institute for Excellence in Teaching) to grow collective leadership and instructional quality

We're creating a culture where continuous learning, reflection, and growth are the norm for both students and staff.

This year, our focus will be implementation of our high-quality instructional materials. Through the support of ILT, cluster, and classroom-based follow-up, our goal is to maximize the potential of standards-aligned, rigorous curricular content through instructional excellence and student ownership to help our students continue to achieve at high levels. We celebrate the growth of our students from the 2024-25 school year and look forward to the growth we will see in the year ahead!

Surveys show strong community support for the 4-day week:

- Parents appreciated more quality time at home and expanded Friday enrichment offerings.
- Students reported feeling less stressed and more focused during school days.
- Staff cited improved wellness, collaboration, and morale.

What Parents Are Saying

Here's what parents and guardians shared in our April survey:

- My son has brightened up and has more focus on school when he's there.
- It has greatly improved my children's outlook on school and allows for more rest.
- It's been a blessing to schedule appointments without missing school.
- My family has been able to spend more time together on Fridays.
- This year was amazing—please keep the 4-day week!
- We love the 4-day school week and hope it continues into 2025–26.

What Students Are Saying

Students had plenty to say, too—and their enthusiasm stood out:

- Please never take this away—this is the best thing to ever exist.
- The 4-day week helps me spend more time with family and get homework done.
- I've had more energy and motivation to get my work done and get to school.
- I like school a lot more now.
- I love it—it helps with everything.
- It works well because school can be very stressful. Having a day to relax is very nice.
- My grades have improved, and I feel more balanced.

Looking Ahead: Building Momentum

As we enter Year 2 of the 4-day school week, we will:

- Expand enrichment offerings on Fridays through Saydel Community Ed
- Continue investing in high-quality instruction, coaching, and intervention
- Use data and community feedback to inform decisions
- Communicate early and clearly about calendar changes
- Remain committed to our mission: serving every student's unique learning needs
- Continue investing in professional learning and leadership development
- Monitor and celebrate progress as we work toward our academic goals

Our focus remains simple: High-quality teaching and learning, every day, in every classroom. Thank you for your continued trust, belief, and support. Together, we're building a stronger, more flexible, and more student-centered school system.

District to Implement Student Fees Following Board Approval

To help cover rising costs, the Saydel Board of Education approved implementing student textbook fees at its March 10, 2025 meeting. This fee will start in the 2025-26 school year. It will help the school district keep important programs and materials in use. The district will look at fees each year to make sure they are fair and clear. Families may still be charged technology fees if school devices are misused and library fines if books are not returned.



Why Student Fees?

Like many school systems across the state, Saydel Schools is facing budget challenges due to stagnant funding, inflation, lack of new residential construction and increasing operational expenses. After careful evaluation, administration recommended student fees as a measure to

preserve education opportunities while maintaining fiscal responsibility. A textbook fee is authorized by Iowa Code Section 301.1 and is utilized by most districts.

"We remain committed to providing an exceptional educational experience to all students," said Board President Gary Christensen II. "These fees help ensure we continue to support classroom learning."

What the Fees Will Support

Student fees will help offset the cost of:

- Textbooks
- Electronic textbooks
- Supplementary instructional materials
- Software used for instruction
- Workbooks

Fee amounts will vary by building and will be set each Spring before the start of the next school year.

Waiver and Reduction Options Available

The district understands that fees may place a financial strain on some families. To ensure equitable access for all students, waiver and reduction options will be available for families who qualify under federal income guidelines.

- A fee waiver is required and is currently part of the student registration process.
- A family's eligibility for <u>free or reduced fees</u> will be determined using the household income survey, which helps the district assess need based on income levels.

"Our priority is to keep opportunities open for every student," said Amber Ray, Executive Director of Business and Operations. "Families facing financial hardship will be able to utilize the waiver and eligibility process to possibly reduce or eliminate the fees."

What's Next

In early October, families will receive detailed information including:

- Fee schedules by building
- · Payment instructions and timelines
- Waiver and reduction processes
- Frequently asked questions

"This decision supports our commitment to sustaining the high-quality programs our families expect," said Traci Lust, Executive Director of Schools. "We thank the community for their continued support."

Saydel Transitions To Infinite Campus

Infinite Campus is a comprehensive student information system used by many school districts around the state, and especially in the metro area. Saydel Community Schools is transitioning

from PowerSchool to Infinite Campus for the 2025-26 school year.

Infinite Campus provides a centralized platform where parents can access real-time information about their child's education, including grades, attendance, assignments, schedules, and communication from teachers and school staff. The system is designed to keep families informed and engaged in their child's academic progress throughout the school year.

One of the most valuable features for parents is the Campus Parent portal, which is accessible via web or mobile app. This portal allows parents to monitor their child's performance, view report cards, check for missing assignments, and receive notifications about important school updates. The messaging feature also supports direct communication with teachers, helping parents stay involved with their students' education.

Infinite Campus helps create a strong home-to-school connection by promoting transparency and timely access to critical information. Parents can support their child's success by regularly reviewing the portal, encouraging good study habits, and collaborating with teachers. By using Infinite Campus effectively, families and schools work together to provide a more supportive and informed learning environment.

Introducing Saydel's New Technology Director

Saydel welcomed Bill Gruman as the new Director of Technology, where he is responsible for the development, implementation and maintenance of all areas of technology. He directs and provides leadership for information technology functions including user technical support, vendor relationships, data center/server administration, application development, classroom integration, network management/support, project management and budget development. Gruman also coordinates technology planning and collaboration with district stakeholders.

Gruman began working at Saydel June 9. Prior to his position at Saydel, he was a long-time teacher and coach, and most recently the Technology Integrationist at Grinnell-Newburg Community Schools from 2015-2025.

Bill received his Bachelor of Arts degree in math and physics education and a Masters of Arts in Instructional Technology from the University of Northern Iowa.

Gruman resides in Grinnell with his wife Sandra and his daughter Emily (12). They also have three grown children and a daughter-in-law. Gruman is active in a number of community organizations, including 23 years as a volunteer firefighter and long-time Scouting America volunteer.

- Concussion form (must be done yearly at the start of the school year)
- Medical release form (must be done yearly at the start of the school year)


Mackenzie Ireland




Teddy Palmer

Woodside Student Phone Policy & Guidelines

Phones are not to be used during the school day. Every student is assigned a Yondr Pouch to securely store their phone. While the Yondr Pouch is considered school property, it is each student's responsibility to care for their pouch and ensure it is not lost or damaged.

DAILY PROCESS

As students arrive in their first class of the school day, they will:

- 1. Turn their phone off.
- 2. Place their phone inside their Pouch and secure it in front of a school staff member.
- 3. Store their Pouch in their backpack/locker/chromebook case for the day.

At the end of the day, students will open their Pouch, remove their phone, and put their Pouch in a designated bin. Students will pick up their designated pouch each morning.

*Students arriving late or leaving early will pouch/unpouch their phones in the Main Office.

VIOLATIONS

Pouch Damage / Lost Pouch / Using Phone During School

 If a student damages their Yondr Pouch or is caught using their phone, administration or their designee will collect the phone and Pouch, and parents/guardians will be contacted for a required pickup. Consequences may include community service, in-school suspension, out-ofschool suspension, detention, contract, and/or a \$25 fee for a replacement Pouch. Any student who attempts to bypass placing their phone or device in the Yondr Pouch will be subject to disciplinary action.


Examples of damage:

- Deep scratches on the globe and on the green ring around it
- Intentional pen marks on the inside of the Pouch
- Bent pins
- Pin and button not fully recessing, due to pin damage

Forgetting to put the phone in a Pouch

If a student forgets to put their phone in a Yondr Pouch, their phone will be collected, and the administration or designee will communicate home via email/phone call to the parent or guardian of the policy violation. The phone will be returned to the student at dismissal.

If a student consistently forgets or refuses to place their phone in a Yondr Pouch, they will be required to leave their phone in the main office each day. A plan will be implemented to ensure





compliance. All disciplinary actions determined by the administration or their designee will be communicated to the parent or guardian and are subject to change based on the situation.

3. Continued Cell Phone Policy

We remain committed to fostering a focused and respectful learning environment. Our current cell phone policy will continue: students must keep phones out of reach during instructional time (from bell to bell), either in backpacks or in designated wall holders. This policy supports a new state law prohibiting phone use during instruction. If a student violates this policy, the phone will be



held in the office for the remainder of the day. Repeated violations may result in the use of a Yondr pouch—a magnetically locked pouch that allows students to carry, but not access, their phone during the day.

While we hope not to implement a schoolwide Yondr policy, it is an option if misuse becomes widespread. Exceptions will be made for students with specific accommodations (medical needs, IEPs, 504 plans, translation tools, etc.).

4. Student Schedules

Schedules are being finalized and will be available on Infinite Campus. Please note that changes may still occur through August 7. If you notice an issue after that date, contact our Counseling Assistant Leslie Nedved (nedvedleslie@saydel.net), with your requested change and the reason. We'll do our best to accommodate valid requests, though some changes may not be possible due to class size limits or scheduling constraints. Ms. Nedved is available Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 6:00 AM to 4:00 PM. All requests must be made before August 28. No changes will be made after the first week unless they were submitted prior to this deadline.

Bre Suntken


