SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Douglas Wheeler



Families and Community Members of Saydel CSD,

I hope this message finds you and your family well as we enter the fall season. The school year is in full swing. Students and staff are settling in for another great year of learning in Saydel Schools.

Enrollment this year is 1368 which is steady with last year's enrollment. We also continue to enroll new students weekly. 19% of our students and families are attending Saydel on open enrollment from another district. The number of families choosing to open enroll their students to Saydel continues to be double the number of families who open enroll out. Attracting students from other districts is evidence of our ability to offer high quality academic and extra-curricular opportunities through a highly personal experience. The work of our staff and support of our community will ensure Saydel continues to grow as a destination district for families.

There is a great deal of recent media attention regarding the increasing number of Iowa schools being labeled "in need of assistance" under the 2001 No Child Left Behind Act. According to this landmark legislation, 100% of students were to be proficient in math and reading by 2014 Iowa Assessments. Even with marked improvement on the Iowa Assessments last April, we still have a school in our district that meet the criteria for "in need of assistance" and others that have been identified in the past. As a district, this year we have been removed from the watch list for reading and math, met participation requirements and the "other academic indicators" measured under NCLB. This is a huge accomplishment given the increasing expectations of NCLB. In this update, I want to give a quick overview of some No Child Left Behind basics:

The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) requires the Iowa Department of Education to collect data in grades 3-8 and 11 on an annual basis in order to determine if school districts and buildings have reached state adequate yearly progress (AYP) targets. Iowa Assessment performance data, participation rates, average daily attendance and graduation rates are included in a school's designation.

Calculations are for a grade level and not a cohort. For example, our calculation for $4^{\rm th}$ grade in 2013 was based on comparing the 2014 $4^{\rm th}$ grade student performance with the performance of students in $4^{\rm th}$ grade in 2013, NOT from comparing the growth of the $4^{\rm th}$ graders from $3^{\rm rd}$ to $4^{\rm th}$ grade.


Removal from the "in need of assistance" list depends on a district's ability to decrease the number of students being labeled as non-proficient within a grade level. Being identified does not necessarily mean that a cohort of students is losing ground as measured by Iowa Assessments. In fact, last April all but one grade level had marked cohort improvement in reading and all but two had a marked cohort improvement in math.

How does Saydel's identification compare with the state? 45 out of the 345 school districts in Iowa were labeled as Districts in Need of Assistance (DINA) based on '13/'14 assessments, up from 41 in '12/'13. Saydel is not on this list of DINA schools. 737 public schools or 54.4% of Iowa schools were labeled as Schools In Need of Assistance in '13/'14, up 7.2% from 47.2% in '12/'13. Saydel has one school, Cornell, that is identified SINA. To be removed from SINA, each grade needs to reduce the number of students not proficient in reading and math by 10% (roughly seven students per grade). Our staff is working hard to deliver the instruction that will improve yearly student performance on Iowa Assessments and other measures of academic growth.

This year we are utilizing our professional development dollars and time to align our curriculum with the Common CORE curriculum Iowa Assessments attempt to measure. Teachers are working to ensure standards are sufficiently addressed within each grade level and from one grade level to the next. Accomplishing this task is ongoing and will provide students with a guaranteed learning experience preparing them not only for success on Iowa Assessments and college readiness assessments like the ACT, but also increasing college and career readiness.

Along with a strong focus on curriculum, Teachers are forming new working relationships in the classroom through a co-teaching model. In a co-teaching model, two teachers (one regular education teacher and one special education teacher) collaborate in designing learning experiences that better support both regular education and special education learners in a classroom. Regular and special education students have always sat alongside each other in our classrooms, this model seeks to elevate the experience and support for all learners in a classroom through collaborative planning, targeted support and reducing the teacher to student ratio in the classroom.

In addition to a great deal of work in the classroom, contractors have been working hard to complete the major bond referendum projects. Taxpayers are often surprised to learn that this 7.9 million dollar referendum did not increase their total tax rate. The total tax rate per \$1,000 for property owners in Saydel is still significantly less than surrounding areas and slightly lower than the average of all Iowa districts. The chart below is a total tax rate comparison for Saydel as well as the state average and the average of the five districts bordering Saydel. Not only are we providing a top-quality learning experience, we are doing so in a way that is a great value to our taxpayers.

While our unseasonably wet weather has impacted our project completion date, our bond referendum projects are within budget and will deliver high quality facilities for our students.

Please join us October 10 for our grand opening open house at the high school. From 5:00-6:30 community members can tour the new facilities at the high school. After the football game, there will be a Booster Club-supported celebratory fireworks show to thank the community for their investment in our children.

If you have made it to this point in my letter, thank you for your perseverance. I wanted to end on a personal note. The past few months of work have been some of the best in my career. This positive experience is due to the overwhelming support I have received from the community. I continue to be impressed and inspired by the pride our community has in its schools. Please tell your friends, neighbors and relatives the wonderful stories you have shared with me about this great district. Enjoy the fall weather!

Woodside Middle School Christopher Feldhans, Principal

It is hard to believe that we are 5 weeks into the 2014 - 2015 school year. I want to share some great news about our lowa Assessment scores from last year. Woodside Middle School saw growth in 11 of our 12 tested areas of Reading, Math, and Science, in grades 5 - 8. Our growth in Reading and Math were significant enough to move Woodside from the School in Need of Assistance (SINA) list into DELAY status. With one more year of continued growth, Woodside will be able to be completely removed from the SINA list altogether. As we work with your children this year we will spend a significant amount of time talking with them about where they are academically, and where we would like to be. These conversations will be centered around Goal Setting. As a parent, you can work with your student every night by setting a time for them to read independently, or with you. It is also very powerful for adults to read to their children of any age. This provides a model of what a fluent reader sounds like. We look forward to seeing all parents at Conferences on October 2nd and 7th. If you have not yet scheduled your conference with your child's teacher, please do so right away.

National Merit Scholar Semifinalist

Nick Dolan, senior, is being recognized as a National Merit Scholar Semifinalist. Nick is one of these semifinalists that represent the highest-scoring entrants on the Preliminary SAT (PSAT) and are less than 1 percent of each state's seniors. This is a great accomplishment as over 1.4 million students in more than 22,000 high schools entered this program by taking the PSAT.

College Preparation

One of the components of Saydel's Vision 2018 is that 100% of our students will be career and/or college ready. We are working toward this on a daily basis with every class in our high school. We also have students taking dual enrollment classes (students earn both high school and DMACC credit through courses at the high school) and post-secondary enrollment classes (PSEO-classes at an area college). During the 2013-2014 school year, we had 104 students earn college credit with the average student earning over 6 college credits last year. This fall we have 86 students enrolled in college credit classes. These classes are a great way for students to prepare themselves for life after high school as well as ease some of the financial burden of paying for college.

We are hosting our college planning and financial aid seminar from 7:00 - 9:00 pm on October 28^{th} in the high school auditorium. This is a great opportunity to learn more about the process of planning, applying for and funding education after high school.

2014-2015 High School Goals

As we begin another a great year of learning at Saydel High School, we have set the following school goals for Iowa Assessments.

11th grade

Reading-5% increase of advanced students and 5% increase of advanced and proficient students combined Math-4% increase of advanced students and 5% increase of advanced and proficient students combined the grade

Reading-6% increase of advanced students and 6% increase of advanced and proficient students combined Math-5% increase of advanced students and 3% increase of advanced and proficient students combined 9th grade

Reading-10% increase of advanced students and 8% increase of advanced and proficient students combined Math-6% increase of advanced students and 9% increase of advanced and proficient students combined 12th grade-as measured by the Work Keys assessment

Reading and Math-17% Platinum Level, 18% Gold Level, 33% Silver Level, and 18% Bronze Level

Not only have we set a school goal, but each individual teacher and student has set a personal goal.

Iowa Reading Corps is a replication of the successful Minnesota Reading Corps program model and sees real growth in its students.

We are excited to announce that Madelyn Schoonover will be serving in our school as an Iowa Reading Corps AmeriCorps member! Madelyn will serve through our local United Way to participate in summer tutoring, Summer Feeding Service Program, and/or summer reading programs at local libraries. 
