SAYDEL BOYS CROSS COUNTRY TAKES THE CROWN!!!

The Saydel Cross Country team competed in two meets this week, the Heart of Iowa Conference meet on Monday in Ames, Iowa at the Iowa State University Cross Country Course and their home meet, held on the Saydel High School Campus. Both meets went well for the Eagles as the wind down the season, peaking towards next week's district meet in Pella, Iowa, at Central College's cross country course.

Monday brought the HOIAC meet to determine the conference champion, as well as All-Conference runners for the season. The Saydel boys fared well at the meet finishing with 2 All-Conference runners in Casey Roberts, who finished his conference career as a 4-time All-Conference athlete, and David Parker, who earned his first All-Conference designation. The boys as a team missed out on a 2nd place conference finish by 1 point, falling behind 3A #1 ranked Gilbert and CMB.

Other highlights included Ada Miklus, Jordan Johnson, Cody Boozell, Josh Green, Joey Hassett, Austin Moen, David Parker, Justin Roepsch, Alex Scott, and Joe Smith ALL IMPROVING their times from the first meet of the year (ran on the same course), even with some of the worst running conditions they have even ran in.

Saydel came in on Thursday with high expectations for their home meet and they didn't disappoint. Lyndsay Bianchi placed another time in Saydel's top 10 for the course running an 18:57 on the day and taking 20th place for the girls.

The boys came in running for another team first place victory and they got just that. With Saydel runners Roberts, Parker, and Hassett taking the first 3 place in the meet and Nathen Nelson taking 5th, the Eagle has a good start to claiming the championship. Justin Roepsch rounded out the scoring for the Eagles finishing 12th, good enough for a team score of 23 and a first place plaque. Not to be outshined, the 6 and 7 runners for Saydel, Joe Smith and Kole Walker, finished 17th and 20th, earning medals for theirs efforts!

Saydel takes on districts Thursday, hoping to put multiple male runners in the state meet for the first time in 20 years and possibly qualify as a team for the first time since 1994. Wish the Eagles good luck on the rest of their already stellar season!

The Saydel football team continued it's very difficult stretch of their schedule by hosting the Carlisle Wildcats last Friday. Carlisle will likely finish runnerup in Class 3A District 7, as they fell 17-6 to #1 Pella the previous week.

Senior Grant Sherman led the Saydel offense with 117 yards on five receptions, including an 81-yard touchdown catch from Sophomore Devin Porter in the second quarter. Sherman also carried the ball once for 30 yards. Porter carried the ball four times for 11 yards and scored the other touchdown for the Eagles.

The defense was led by Junior Rece Martin who recorded eight tackles. Seniors Brandon Hill and Marshall Anderson collected six and 5.5 tackles respectively. Senior Corey Denning intercepted a Carlisle pass during the second quarter, his first of the season.

Saydel travels to Pella tonight to

play the top-ranked Dutch. Kickoff is 7:30PM.

The Saydel 9th grade team hosted PCM on wet and cold Monday evening. These playing conditions made it extremely difficult for either team to consistently move the football, as both teams
