Eagle Football

Saydel traveled to Norwalk last week to battle the Warriors in a Class 3A District 7 contest. Both teams entered the game with identical overall and district records (1-3, 0-2). Norwalk had come off of two very difficult road trips in as many weeks, traveling to district-favorites Carlisle and Pella.

Norwalk took advantage of the home crowd and Home-coming atmosphere to jump out to a quick lead and control the football game from start to finish. The 49-6 loss dropped the Eagles to 1-4 on the season and 0-3 in District 7 play.



The Eagles were unable to produce

much offense against Warriors' defense. Saydel managed just 66 yards rushing on 26 carries. The Eagles were only able to gain 57 yards passing on the evening. The 123 yards of total offense and six points were both season-lows.

Senior Grant Sherman scored the lone touchdown for the Eagles on a 16-yard run in the fourth quarter. Sherman also connected on a personal best 70-yard punt during the second quarter. Freshman Trevor Sprague led the Saydel defense with 6 tackles. Senior Brandon Hill recorded four tackles, Junior Jacob Philipsen recorded 3.5 tackles, and Freshman Craig Garrison added three stops.

Saydel travels to Knoxville tonight to play the Panthers (1-4) and are also looking for their first district win of the season.

On Monday, the JV Eagles defeated the Tigerhawks of Colfax-Mingo 40-0 at home, thanks in-large part to big plays on offense. Junior Ceejay Bolich caught two touchdown passes from Freshman TJ Stephenson. The first from eight yards out and the second a 66-yard connection. Stephenson also scored on a 2-yard touchdown run. Freshman Trevor Sprague scored on touchdown runs of 65 and 71 yards. Stephenson threw his third touchdown pass of the night to Junior Andrew Smith, a 14-yard strike to close out the scoring for the evening. Saydel (JV) will host Collins-Maxwell-Baxter on Monday, October 6.


