

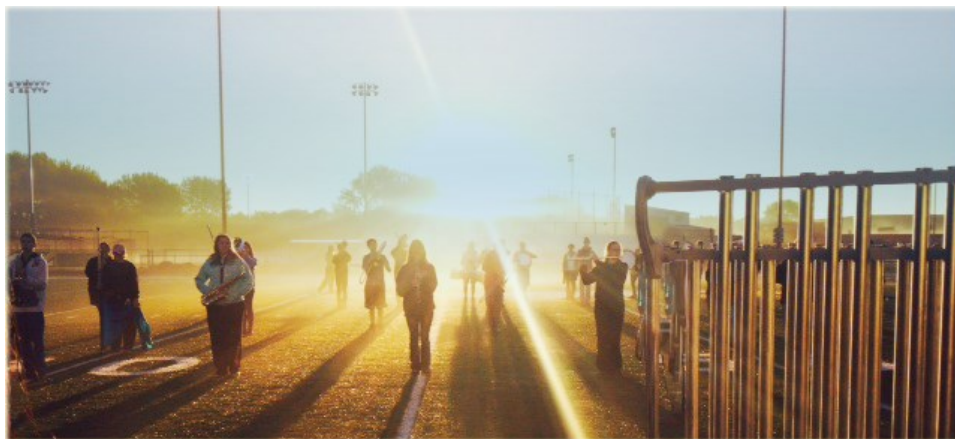

Cheerleaders enjoyed homecoming last week. They were able to help with the football jersey silent auction held during a varsity volleyball game. They also did a surprise visit to Cornell at dismissal time. The cheerleaders brought with them some football players and the Eagle mascot. They cheered in the halls and some classrooms as the stu-

dents walked to their bus lines. Many of the cheerleaders and football players were former students of Cornell so their visit was very special. The students enjoyed the cheers and



were excited to see the cheerleaders and football players.

Eagles come up short vs. Oskaloosa

A football field is 100 yards long by 53.33 yards wide. That's 300 feet by 160 feet. Despite these dimensions, the game of football is said to be a game of inches. Last Friday, in front of a standing room only crowd at Saydel Stadium for Homecoming, the Eagles proved that statement to be true. Twice the Eagles fumbled on 4th down and less than six inches, falling to the Oskaloosa Indians 44-30. The loss drops Saydel to 0-2 in the district and 1-3 overall.

Saydel took an early 6-0 lead on Clayton Sommers' first touchdown run. The Indians responded with a 23 point run, before Grant Sherman connected with Zach McBride on the final play of the first half, cutting the halftime deficit to 23-12. After the lone Oskaloosa turnover to start the second half, Devin Porter hit McBride for another touchdown pass, making it 23-18 Oskaloosa. The Eagle defense forced a punt on the Indians sec-

ond possession of the half. The next Saydel possession resulted in Sommers' second rushing touchdown of the game and gave the Eagles a 24-23 lead. Unfortunately, Oskaloosa rallied for



three unanswered touchdowns to take a 44-24 lead. The Eagles would not go quietly though, scoring on their final possession as Sherman hit McBride again for the fifth Saydel touchdown, cutting the deficit to the final margin.

Clayton Sommers carried the ball 29 times for 122 yards and two touchdowns. He also completed 14 of 18 pass attempts for 135 yards. Grant Sherman completed six of seven passes for 96 yards and two touchdowns while Devin Porter connected with Zach McBride on his only pass attempt, a 24-yard touchdown. Seven different Eagles caught passes on the evening. Zach McBride led the way with four receptions for 96 yards and a school-record three touchdowns. Porter caught a team-high seven passes for 75 yards, while Justin Carr added five catches for 61 yards. Sommers added two receptions while Dylan Coffin, Rece Martin, and Sherman each caught one pass. The Eagles gained 392 yards of offense.

Defensively the Eagles were led by Sommers, Brandon Hill, and Craig Garrison with 5 tackles each. Martin also recovered an Oskaloosa fumble.

Saydel put one girl and two boys in the top 10 fastest times at Adel, with Lyndsay Bianchi running a 19:14 for the girls, as well as Casey Roberts and David Parker at 17:40 and 18:29 for the boys. The meet was highlighted by the boys push for the team title. With a goal set on running with Ballard, who got the best of the Eagles at their home meet, the boys were chasing down red

jerseys for the 3.1 mile trek, however with that in mind the boys from Carlisle slid past the green and gold into the first place slot, accumulating 42 points to Saydel's 48, and Ballard's 56. There was only slight disappointment in the loss however, as the goal of unsettling Ballard came to fruition. Saydel placed 4 of its 7 Varsity runners

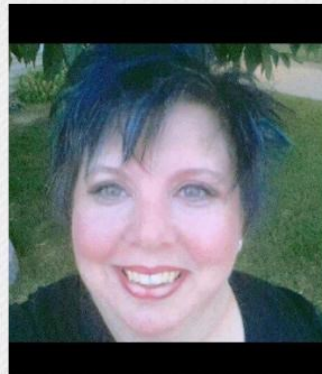

The boys team edged out a 2nd place team finish, defeating Ogden by 6 points, but falling behind 9th ranked (3A) DCG. The runner-up finish earned the all the Varsity runners medals for their effort.

Lyndsay Bianchi continued to make her mark on the history books as she added another top

10 time to her resume, running an 18:17 on the afternoon.

The top boys were Casey Roberts (17:08, 2nd place overall), and David Parker (17:36, 4th place overall). Both of those times also placed on the top 10 for a Saydel runner at the Roland Story meet. The boys also improved their season record to 36-7 on the year, while only suffering losses to 4 total teams (Gilbert, #2 in 3A; DCG, #9 in 3A, Ballard, and Carlisle).
