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### **SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE** Douglas Wheeler

Saydel Families and supporters,

Spring is here! While this winter was not as harsh as last, I cannot help but get excited as the temperature warms and nature springs back to life. As I reflect on our work this school year, I cannot help but have the same excitement for how the efforts of our staff will carry forward into the coming year. This work will result in great opportunities for our students. I want to share some of this great work and some items we will be working to implement in the coming year.

We are continuing our work to enhance our program of curriculum, instruction and assessment. Teachers in all areas have engaged in the process of identifying what students should know, understand and be able to do using the CORE curriculum as a guiding document. Staff examined where elements of essential learning should occur in a year of instruction and mapped out when and how this learning should take place. The work of curriculum planning is ongoing and will also be influenced by our next steps of program enhancement. As we continue this work, we are transitioning to the analysis of how we assess our students. In other words, do the methods we use to assess students tell us if they have learned what we intended them to learn? Incorporated in the assessment conversation is an analysis of how we give feedback to students so they know exactly what is needed to demonstrate proficiency in a concept or skill. This curriculum revision process is on-going, but through the process, we have identified areas in need of material and resources support.

This year, we have adopted a new English Language Arts (ELA) curriculum at the elementary level and have started to pilot this program for K-12 implementation next year. In addition to reading, next year students will experience a new science experience K-8 and the K-5 Math adoption implemented this year will be enhanced with a new math program for 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade. At the High School, students next year will experience

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several new "Programs of Study." The intent of a program of study is to create a sequence of classes for students to explore and interest area. These programs of study will offer new opportunities for 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students to experience purposefully sequenced and connected classes in the areas of culinary arts, art, and business. The purpose of this curriculum work and the associated materials adoptions is to create an academic program that is aligned K-12 and provides our students the skills, knowledge and experiences needed to be successful beyond high school, wherever that journey might take them. This work has involved countless hours of work by staff. Our staff should be commended for their excitement and engagement in this process.

In addition to our work on <u>what</u> our students will experience, we continue to effectively utilize and support the Tap system to develop <u>how</u> students experience the curriculum. Teachers continue to meet weekly for embedded professional development guided by assessment data analysis. The Tap system allows us to examine student and school growth frequently and align teacher learning experiences to the needs of our students.

To enhance our efforts to provide students with the best academic experience in the metro, we have started the process of developing a 10-year facility master plan. In partnership with Haila Architecture, we are conducting teacher, student and parent focus groups to gain input on what we should do to develop our facilities in order to provide the best student experience. A large focus of this work will be the design of learning spaces that enhance our continued work in curriculum and instruction. This means creating spaces that are engaging, comfortable and flexible to support collaboration and creativity in every classroom. Our targeted completion date for this site master plan is June.

The work above could not be done without the support and trust of our families, community and staff. As we approach planning for next year, I am excited for what this support continues to bring to our students. Thank you for supporting your child and Saydel Schools.

This course will develop skills that successful people use on a daily basis.

<u>September 1, 2015</u>– Last date for open enrollment requests for entering kindergarten students for the 2015-2016 school year.

Applications must be filed with the district of residence *and* the receiving district. Parents and students should be aware that open enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility for participation in varsity sports.
